

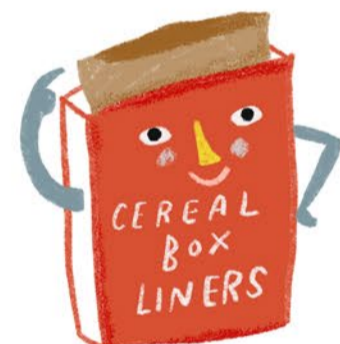
Be a soft plastics warrior
